"The Day is Short and The Task is Great...  
You Are Not Required to Complete the Task, But  
Neither Are You Free to Walk Away From It."

These two proverbs, found back-to-back in The Ethics of the Fathers, share some valuable teachings. When the Mishnah says "The Day is Short", the rabbis of the Talmud were not speaking about 'one day' but, 'one's lifetime.' ## *L'Dor v'dor Award*

### *Phyllis Kandl*

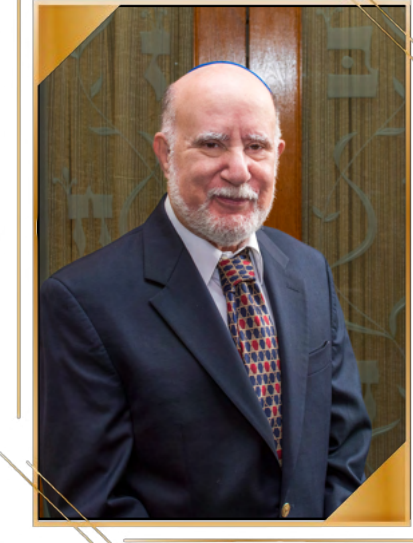


Phyllis Kandl grew up in Cranford and has been a member of TBEMC her entire life. Her parents, Burton z”l and Doris z”l Mandell, joined Temple Beth El in September 1958. Phyllis followed in her family’s footsteps, always being active in the Jewish community. Phyllis and her family attended services weekly. Her father was a USY advisor for many years, first in Morristown and Lake Hiawatha, then for TBE’s chapter for more than 10 years. He also served as a synagogue trustee, officer, and vice president. Phyllis’s mother was active in B’nai B’rith Women and was president of the local chapter in the late 1970s. She was an active participant in numerous synagogue and Sisterhood activities. Phyllis’s grandmother was also president of her B’nai B’rith chapter. Phyllis's brothers Steven and David have been active in USY, Hillel, and their synagogues. Synagogue involvement runs strong in this family!

As for Phyllis, she was also active in USY as a teenager, followed by Hillel involvement in college. After marrying Lance, the couple helped organize Beth El Lites for young members, as original founders. Phyllis was active in the TBEMC Board of Education, first as a member, then as co-president, and finally as president for many years. She continues to be active on the Education committee, B’nai Mitzvah committee, and has been an officer and member of the Board of Trustees. Phyllis and Lance are members of TBEMC’s Legacy Circle. Phyllis raised her children as she was raised to be active members of the synagogue

community. Her sons Douglas and Matthew attended services since they were young, volunteered at events, set up the annual summer BBQ, called BINGO numbers at Men’s Club events, and were active USY members. In college they were both active in Hillel. Douglas helped form Koach on Campus, to serve college age Conservative students. His wife Melanie was also active in Hillel, and the couple met in Israel during an Onward Israel program. As adults they continue their involvement in the Jewish community. Their children Hailey and Dorothy are being raised the same way, attending "Bagels and Babies" and celebrating holidays with the family.

Phyllis has wonderful memories of growing up in the temple, including helping set up for Oneg Shabbats as a teenager, Israeli dancing in the lobby on Friday nights after services, and all the wonderful lifelong friendships she has made along the way. Raising her children in the same synagogue is very meaningful to her, and TBEMC has truly been her second home. Professionally, Phyllis is the program manager of the Hemophilia Center and Sickle Cell program at Newark Beth Israel Medical Center. She is responsible for managing both programs, securing grants and other funding to ensure these patients are provided with the best care. Phyllis is honored to receive this L'Dor v'Dor (from generation to generation) award, as she feels she has followed in the footsteps of her ancestors and is passing on the importance of being an active member of the Jewish community to her children and grandchildren.



Marty Metzger grew up at TBEMC, starting when his parents joined in 1956. The temple was then on South Avenue. His mother was active in Sisterhood and his father was a temple vice president. One of Marty’s early memories is watching them paste up the temple bulletin on the dining room table. Marty, his sister, nieces and nephews all became b’nai mitzvah at TBEMC. “I don’t remember what I did yesterday, but I can recite a lot of my haftarah from memory,” Marty says. That’s a long time, as Marty was proud to celebrate his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday with friends and family at the temple recently.

After becoming an adult, Marty joined TBEMC on his own. “I quit the temple for a short period, but came back as I realized the temple was my home,” he says. He passes by it several times a day, as it’s close to his house. It was at TBEMC he met Rosi, the love of his life. “It’s the best thing I ever did through the temple,” he says. Through Rosi, he has three wonderful stepchildren, two grandsons and is looking forward to a granddaughter in September.

Marty is handy, starting his own garage door sales and repair company a year after working as a computer programmer. This handiness led him to work on many temple projects over the years, serving as House Chair for three decades. Those projects included installing a fire and burglar alarm system, new windows, making

renovations after a flood and fire, adding a ramp and lift in the social hall, installing air conditioning throughout the building and a steam system, an A/V system in the youth lounge, new bathrooms, and many more.

In addition to building projects, Marty served on the TBEMC Board of Trustees for many years, and also on the Cemetery Committee. He headed the Yom HaShoah candle project for 10 years, out of respect for the Sperlings. He and Rosi proudly donated and hung the American and Israeli flags in the front windows. “Overall I’ve had great satisfaction working for TBEMC,” he says.

While the temple has been a big focus, Marty has also served on the Federation Board and has been involved with the Cranford Clergy Council. Through the latter, he was recognized with the Martin Luther King, Jr. award.

And now he is being recognized at TBEMC. “I am pleased to be honored with terrific company: Alice, Laura and Aaron, and Phyllis.”

Laura and Aaron Cohen have a long and wonderfully involved history with TBEMC, and with the greater community as well. Members for 43 years (so far), they served together as TBEMC co-presidents. Laura and Aaron have both been president of the YM-YWHA of Union County as well. Laura currently is on its executive board. Laura and Aaron were honored as the 2015 recipients of the Y's Community Leadership Award.

The Cohens have also both been members of the Jewish Federation of Central New Jersey Board of Trustees, with Laura taking on a Board officer role as well. Laura has been a trustee on the Jewish Community Foundation of Greater MetroWest's board. While many of their community involvements align, they have taken different leadership paths, even in the same organizations. Aaron got his start with his Y service on the Early Childhood Committee and was a founding member of the Save The Y effort in 1985. He was also instrumental in the rebirth of the Y's Sharks swim team in 1989. He has also been honored with the Y's Abe Isak President's Award.

At TBEMC, Aaron has been a member and now chair of the Sustainable Pledge Model committee that introduced TBEMC's highly successful flexible dues model. Laura is well known for her adult education "Torah with Laura" classes, and her dedication in recruiting teens and adults to participate in Torah chanting, Megillah reading, haftarah and other ritual skills. She's at Shabbat services most Saturdays as its ringmaster, assigning aliyot and coordinating (and overseeing) Torah and haftarah readers. Laura does all this in a volunteer capacity. Always encouraging to new and current participants, she is quick to warmly praise and thank those who step forward.

Outside the Jewish community, Laura and Aaron have been active in fundraising and advocacy for the National Multiple Sclerosis Society (NMSS). Laura was recognized by the NMSS in 2019 with the Circle of Distinction award for raising over \$1 million as captain of the Walk MS fundraising team. "The Mitzvah Squad" got its start at TBEMC in 2002, and by 2023, ranked 8th nationally for fundraising as a friends and family team. Laura just completed her chair position of a three county NMSS Community Council, and she remains a council member. Aaron has volunteered in many capacities on community boards and committees including as the current vice president of the Union County Advisory Board on the Disabled. He is also current vice secretary of The Pointe at Garwood Condominium Board, and is a past networking group leader and job transition mentor for the ETP Network. Aaron graduated from Brown University with ScB and ScM degrees in computer science. Before retiring in 2021, he was a software development executive and consultant with extensive experience managing the translation of critical business needs into technical solutions.

Laura earned an MBA in finance from Rutgers Graduate School of Management, a BA from Simmons University, and a Bachelor of Jewish Education from Hebrew College in Boston. In 2020, Laura retired from a career in the banking and leasing industries, most recently as a senior credit analyst underwriting global leasing transactions at Hewlett-Packard Enterprise Financial Services Company.

Laura and Aaron are proud parents to Sarah Cohen (Daniel) Portilla, Aviva Cohen (Rabbi Scott) Roland, and Jonathan (Alyssa Nydick) Cohen, and grandparents of five grandchildren.



Alice Goldfarb has been a beloved member of TBEMC since 1985, when she moved to the area and married Mickey Katcher. She quickly became active, serving as Sisterhood president from 1987-1990, followed by chairing the Adult Education Committee from 1990-2011. In that role, Alice created programs and planned trips, including Shabbatons, bus trips, film and commentator series, cultural series, and scholar-in-residence events. People have fond memories of weekends at the Raleigh, carpooling together and gathering with other families. Some of the other memorable trips include bus trips to the U.S. Holocaust Museum in Washington D.C., West Point, visiting Jewish Philadelphia and Baltimore, the Yiddish Book Center in Amherst, MA, the New Deal community of Roosevelt, NJ, Ellis Island, the Gomez Mill House in New York state, to New York City to tour the United Nations, Jewish Theological Society, Yeshiva University and museums, and attending Broadway shows like *The Last Night of Ballyhoo* and *Parade*. Last but not least, she organized a trip to Livingston's Beth Shalom for Dudu Fisher's performance.

Alice planned other cultural activities too, most recently the Jewish Composers on Broadway event at TBEMC. In the past, she's organized Jewish film and commentator series presented by Rabbi Azriel Fellner, and co-chaired a four-synagogue cultural series with Thelma Purdy of Temple Beth Or. Other programs included a presentation by Rabbi Noah Golinkin on "Learning Hebrew in One Day", or another program called, "You know more Yiddish than you think." Educational programs varied from scholar teachings, to "serious fun and discussion" series held in homes, and co-chaired with Dorothy Steinbach. Some of these were part of Shabbatons, with weekend scholars attending Friday night dinners, Saturday lunches and Seudah Shlishit, and events for sponsors. Some were held at Alice's home in Livingston, where she lived with her husband David, whom she married six years after Mickey's death.

If you think this is a comprehensive, diverse and dedicated set of programming, you're not alone. In 1992, Temple Beth El received the Norman Glikin Award for Adult Education, thanks to Alice's work. She has been honored, as well, with United Synagogue's Keter Shem Tov Leadership Award in 2007 (along with husband David), and she's been honored by Cranford and Livingston Hadassah chapters.

While TBEMC has been fortunate to have Alice Goldfarb's talents and friendship, other communities are blessed as well. When living in Knoxville, TN, Alice was deeply involved in her synagogue, Sisterhood, Hadassah, JCC and Federation. In New Jersey, Alice has served on the Women's Philanthropy Board of Greater MetroWest Federation and is currently is on the regional board of Israel's United Hatzalah service.

While Alice is a committed TBEMC supporter, she has another home at Temple Beth Shalom in Livingston, where she co-chairs an active Adult Education program called "Talks & Treks," which includes many of the same amazing types of programs she has arranged for TBEMC over the years. Alice is the proud mother of Deborah, who made Aliyah 16 years ago and lives in Jerusalem, and of Diane, who lives in Atlanta. Alice deeply loves her grandchildren Benjamin and Goldie, and great-grandchildren Penelope and Marion.
