Sustaining Pledge Model

The Sustaining Pledge Model (SPM) committee thanks all of our members and associate members for sustaining our community this year through annual giving. If you have already paid your 2018-19 pledge, thank you! Your donation is critical for us to continue realizing our mission as a holy community. If you still have an outstanding balance, thank you for your contributions to date, and we are depending on you to fulfill your pledge by June 30th, the end of our fiscal year.

Within a few weeks you will be receiving a pledge form for the 2019-20 fiscal year, our second year in the SPM. The SPM will remain similar to last year – instead of having mandatory dues, members will fulfill a voluntary pledge. This model has permitted us to eliminate barriers to membership and better align our approach to annual giving with our being a warm, welcoming community. Additionally, there will be a couple of new features:

We recognize that in addition to financial contributions, our community relies on a wonderful cadre of volunteers. We thank you for what you do! In order to help sustain a pipeline of volunteers, we will be generating a database of volunteers to help match people to specific volunteer opportunities. Look for this form and the SPM letter.

Although annual giving is critical to support our synagogue's operations, some people like to support and be associated with specific events. Additionally, some people like to have a giving opportunity connected with the High Holidays. We will be initiating a program this summer to enable these kinds of sponsorship opportunities, in alignment with the High Holidays. Be on the lookout later this year.

TBEMC Religious School Provides Education for All Age Groups

The TBEMC Religious School fosters love for G-d, prayer, Torah, and community. With our new principal Michael Herman, and education directed by Rabbi Neil, we offer a range of Jewish education for the entire family.

Religious School is Sundays from 9-12 for all grades, and Tuesdays from 4-6 for 3rd-7th grades. When students reach Bar/Bat Mitzvah, they will have learned skills in Hebrew reading, prayer and understanding of Jewish holidays.

Students begin in kindergarten through 2nd grade with hands-on learning that includes holidays and Hebrew letters. Temple membership is not required until 3rd grade. With our new Sustaining Pledge Model, more young families are joining an earlier time, because we have a more flexible donation model without a set dues amount.

The Gan Katan class held bi-weekly for ages 3-4, is filled with joy through art, music, storytelling, dancing and friendship. Temple membership is not required for this program, which begins the foundation of Jewish life for each child.

Tot Shabbat for children 0-6 years is held monthly and helps light a spark that connects children to Judaism at a young age. We develop the habit and joy of praying with the community. Temple members and non-members are warmly welcomed.

Parents are encouraged to enhance their Jewish education through Shabbat Junior Congregation and Sunday morning prayer service.

We welcome you to register throughout the year for Gan Katan through 7th grade classes. Any time you decide to register is the right time! We recognize that there are traditional and non-traditional family units with unique spiritual needs. It is our goal to open our doors to all who seek a congregation such as TBEMC.

Atid means "future" in Hebrew. As Women's League for Conservative Judaism enters its second century, Torah Fund begins its 77th year, and State of Israel enters its 71st year. We look forward with joy to our future together with you, our sisterhood members and supporters of Torah Fund.

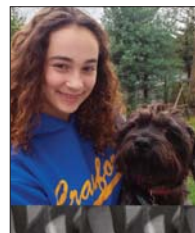
When the classical rabbinic texts speak of the future using the word atid, it usually appears in the phrase "le'atid lavo," which means "in the future to come." By this, they mean either the day when the Messiah will come, or olam haba, the afterlife. Israelis, referring to this life, are known to say with optimism, "Yesh atid," which means "there is a future!"

How do you envision your future? Your personal future, the future of your family, the future of your community, of the United States, Canada, and Israel? When you dream of a bright future, is it in the next world or this one? The seminaries of the Conservative/Masorti movement, which we support through Torah Fund, are doing the great work that helps us navigate our future together, as one people. Our sisterhoods provide the social and educational networks – the extended family – that help us go forward into our future, as Jewish women, with confidence.

The 5779 Torah Fund pin envelopes the Hebrew word for "future" (atid) with a stylized Magen David. It represents our wish for a distinctly Jewish future, for ourselves as individuals, for our families, and our communities.

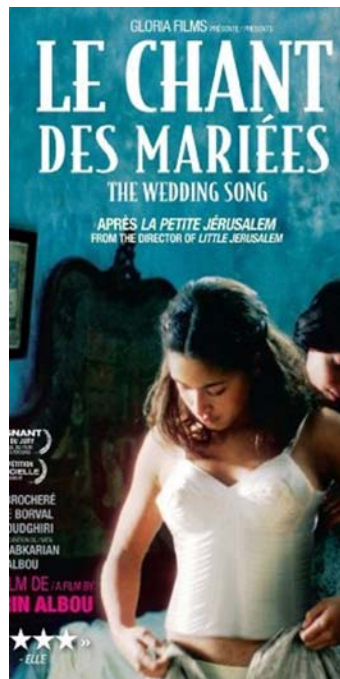

Atid means "future" in Hebrew. As Women's League for Conservative Judaism enters its second century, Torah Fund begins its 77th year, and the State of Israel enters its 71st, we look forward with joy to our future together with you, our sisterhood members and supporters of Torah Fund.

Sisterhood donates all of the profits earned from the sale of vouchers back to TBEMC – to the Religious School, USYers, and special programs. Also, Sisterhood members earn 5% of their purchase price in donor credit, which goes toward their cost of attending the Donor Celebration in June.

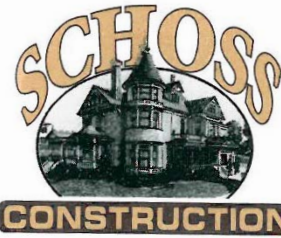

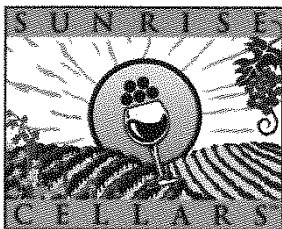
