Rosh HaShanah: Grand Opening or Going Out of Business?

A story is told of a new immigrant who wanted to fulfill the American Dream and open his own grocery and dry goods store. He wasn't quite sure how to get started, so he walked the streets of New York to get some ideas. He noticed a store with a lot of customers and he inquired what was going on. A member of the owner's family told this new immigrant that the store was crowded because it was their Grand Opening. Obviously, lots of people flock to a new store to see what they had and if this was a store they liked.

A few blocks away, he noticed another busy store. This one had a different sign though. It said it was Going out of Business. We have all experienced the great sales to be had in stores going out of business and I am sure we have also seen stores that have been around for years with a Going out of Business sign at their entrance.

The immigrant thought he had figured it all out, so when he opened his new store, he had two signs. One said Grand Opening. The other proclaimed: Going Out of Business. Needless to say, he didn't have many customers because they decided, this guy has to be a 'meshuganer' – a lunatic!

It's a cute story, but let's not move on too quickly from the lesson it teaches us. Rosh HaShanah is "Hayom Harat Olam"– "The birthday of the world." Religious School News



Doni Remba is thrilled to be returning to TBEMC, the synagogue he grew up in and where he became a Bar Mitzvah, as principal of the religious school that he himself attended. He has been a Jewish educator at the elementary, middle and high school levels for over 15 years, and an executive director and consultant for several Jewish nonprofit groups for a decade. He has taught teachers how to design innovative curricula at NewCAJE, the national conference of Jewish educators, and sparked ruach (spirit) as a song leader at a Hebrew-speaking summer camp.

Doni studied Tanach/Hebrew Bible, Talmud and Hebrew literature at the Jewish Theological Seminary, education, psychology and Jewish history at Clark University, graduating with high honors in philosophy and Jewish philosophy from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. He also did doctoral coursework in ethics, philosophy and Jewish history at the University of Chicago. During the last of the four years he lived in Israel, Doni served as the senior foreign press translator for the prime minister of Israel, providing the official English translations for the global media of the Israeli leader's speeches in Hebrew, a task he also performed for the defense and foreign ministers, as well as for the Israel Defense Forces spokesperson. He lives in Westfield with his wife Carole, their teenage daughter Talia, and cat Ari.

Doni's vision for our religious school is to partner with Rabbi Kerbel, our teachers, parents, and staff to foster a joyful learning space where children will experience Judaism as exciting and meaningful, where creative curricula and family programs will shape them into knowledgeable, actively practicing young Jews, inspiring them to explore and embrace their Jewish identities in a lifelong commitment to Jewish community, learning, values and mitzvot.

TBEMC Religious School Provides Education for All Age Groups

The TBEMC Religious School fosters love for G-d, prayer, Torah, and community. We offer a range of Jewish education for the entire family.

Religious School is Sundays from 9-12 for all grades, and Tuesdays from 4-6 for 3rd-7th grades. When students reach Bar/Bat Mitzvah, they will have learned skills in Hebrew reading, prayer and understanding of Jewish holidays.

Students begin in kindergarten through 2nd grade with hands-on learning that includes holidays and Hebrew letters. Temple membership is not required until 3rd grade. With our new Sustaining Pledge Model, more young families are joining an earlier time, because we have a more flexible donation model without a set dues amount.

The Gan Katan class held bi-weekly for ages 3-4, is filled with joy through art, music, storytelling, dancing and friendship. Temple membership is not required for this program, which begins the foundation of Jewish life for each child.

Tot Shabbat for children 0-6 years is held monthly and helps light a spark that connects children to Judaism at a young age. We develop the habit and joy of praying with the community. Temple members and non-members are warmly welcomed.

Parents are encouraged to enhance their Jewish education through Shabbat Junior Congregation and Sunday morning prayer service.

We welcome you to register throughout the year for Gan Katan through 7th grade classes. Any time you decide to register is the right time! We recognize that there are traditional and non-traditional family units with unique spiritual needs. It is our goal to open our doors to all who seek a congregation such as TBEMC.



Volunteering in Israel

A trip to Israel is always something special. Art and I have traveled to Israel many times and while there is much to see, we have already visited many places. Our trips now focus on experiencing Israel and Israeli society rather than seeing places.

Six years ago, I had the option to study combined with a volunteer placement. My volunteer placement was through Skilled Volunteers for Israel and I spent my mornings at an agency called Melabev. Melabev calls itself a Memory Club and those that come there on a daily basis are members. The members suffer from dementia. While most members are of an advanced age (my definition is 20 years older than I am) there are people who are my age and younger. Many have significant mobility issues. Most have full time caregivers that allow them to remain in their homes. However, being at home with a caregiver provides little stimulation which can lead to a more rapid decline. Melabev provides a social setting, stimulation through music, art, crafts, conversation and some physical movement, albeit limited.

Melabev is staffed with caring professionals. As a volunteer, my job is to perform routine tasks to free up the professionals to work with the members. It can be as simple as pouring and serving drinks and serving meals, helping the members with meals or helping in the kitchen. Sometimes it means sitting next to members during music time and singing with them, talking to them about the magazine they are looking at or the weather. Many of the members were professionals and welleducated but dementia has robbed them of much of that. Melabev treats its members with such respect and care and recognizes the dignity of each person.

There were several members that I formed a relationship with in the short time I was there. There was the rabbi; he and I would discuss the weekly parsha. There was the former English teacher that barely spoke but through her facial expressions and gestures signaled she wanted me to sit with her and play percussion instruments with her during music time. One of the men wanted to wander one day, so we walked through the enclosed garden together.

Did I make a difference in their lives I will never know, but they made a difference in mine.

Torah Fund


