A Few Words From the Rabbi... Tu B'Shevat The Return to Nature

On the 9th and 10th of February, we will observe Tu B'Shevat, the Jewish tradition's holiday of nature and the environment that dates back to the Talmud. The New Year for Trees.

Rabbi Nina Beth Cardin writes, "We remember that we live off the earth's resources, that some of those resources are renewable and some are not, that we have the power to transform them into blessings as well as curses, and no one can do it but us. Tu B'-Shevat comes to remind us that in the midst of all of this goodness, we are stewards, not just consumers of the earth and its produce. We must not leave a legacy of waste and poison as we satisfy our appetites and our needs." Let me suggest 3 ways to celebrate Tu B'Shevat:

Go to JNF.org and learn about Israel's efforts to build forests, build reservoirs, reclaim the land and transform the environment. And while you are there, make a donation to plant trees in honor or in memory of loved ones and friends and help Israel bloom!

Google "Tu B'Shevat" and read one or more of many commentaries on this holiday and share ideas, texts and commentaries with your children and grandchildren.

Join us at TBEMC for an intergenerational Tu B'Shevat Seder on Tuesday, February 10 at 5:00 p.m. Adult attendees will join our Religious School students to learn about Tu B'Shevat and sample the fruits and vegetables of Israel to celebrate this great Zionist Holiday!

Every woman has the opportunity to participate in preserving, promoting and perpetuating Conservative/Masorti Judaism through active giving to the Torah Fund Campaign of Women's League in support of the Jewish Theological Seminary (New York, NY), Ziegler School of Rabbinic Studies (Los Angeles, CA), Schechter Institute of Jewish Studies (Jerusalem), Seminario Rabinico Latinoamericano (Buenos Aires), and Zacharias Frankel College (Potsdam).

The Torah Fund campaign began in 1942 as a scholarship fund. In 1963, it merged with the Mathilde Schechter Residence Hall campaign that provided housing for undergraduate students. In time, the campaign identified needs and raised funds for specific projects, including:

This symbolizes the heart of kindness, which Jews enact in ever-widening realms of generosity: from family, to community, to the larger world; from North America, to Israel, to the world; or from sisterhood, to region, to the larger world of Women's League for Conservative Judaism. And as it is said in Psalm 89, may we build a world of kindness.

Donor-Advised Fund

As TBEMC members start your year-end charitable and tax planning, the Jewish Community Foundation of Greater MetroWest announced its new Donor-Advised Fund Synagogue Incentive Initiative.

How does this benefit your synagogue?

When a member of your synagogue opens a donor-advised fund (DAF) with the Jewish Community Foundation (JCF), your synagogue will receive a \$100 donation in their honor. (Your synagogue must be in Greater MetroWest NJ to participate. This opportunity is available through December 31, 2020.) Congregants set aside charitable funds that are available immediately. Congregants can pay for synagogue membership and High Holiday tickets (if applicable) from a DAF.

What is a donor advised-fund?

A DAF is a flexible way for your members to give to their favorite charities, including your synagogue. It simplifies their charitable giving and maximizes tax savings. They can make donations of appreciated assets.

JCF's very competitive, all-in fees are reinvested in the community and support our work. In 2019, over 80% of JCF's grants stayed in the Jewish community. TBEMC Religious School Provides Education for All Age Groups

Religious School is Sundays from 9-12 for all grades, and Tuesdays from 4-6 for 3rd-7th grades. When students reach Bar/Bat Mitzvah, they will have learned skills in Hebrew reading, prayer and understanding of Jewish holidays.

Students begin in kindergarten through 2nd grade with hands-on learning that includes holidays and Hebrew letters. Temple membership is not required until 3rd grade. With our new Sustaining Pledge The TBEMC Religious School fosters love for G-d, prayer, Torah, and community. We offer a range of Jewish education for the entire family.

Model, more young families are joining an earlier time, because we have a more flexible donation model without a set dues amount.

The Gan Katan class held biweekly for ages 3-4, is filled with joy through art, music, storytelling, dancing and friendship. Temple membership is not required for this program, which begins the foundation of Jewish life for each child.
